Received all 4 year old booster immunizations:

Dtap, Polio, MMR and Varicella.

Vision Screening completed at a Health Physical,

by Lion's Club OR a Family Optometrist

Dental Screening at a Health physical OR

by a Dental Provider

Blood lead testing completed at a Health physical

7th grade (and older) students: parents must ensure student has:
Received **BOTH:** Tdap (Tetanus/Acellular Pertussis)
vaccination booster AND a Meningococcal vaccination on
or after 10th birthday.

9th grade students: parents must provide proof student has:

Dental screening by a dental professional within the

last 12 months

12th grade students: parents must ensure student has:

Received 2 DOSES of Meningococcal vaccine; or 1 dose if
first dose was received at 16 years of age or older.
