

Title I Learning Incentive Program

We know that practicing skills outside of the school day is important to improving and maintaining students' reading and math skills and interest. We also know that our students who qualify for Title I are more at-risk for lower test scores and less gains throughout the school year. In order to help combat those areas, we are encouraging students to work on skills outside of the normal school day.

What does that look like? Here are some tips to use:

1. Sit down with your child to review and practice materials in the purple folder. (We know that sometimes this isn't possible, but please try to be consistent in supporting your child's learning as often as possible).
2. Please initial the dated box on the calendar in the purple folder each night that you work with your child. (If you do not work on those materials, please do not initial the box so that the Title I teachers know extra review will need to take place at school.)
3. Keep all materials, including the calendar, inside the purple folder unless the material is marked to keep at home.
4. Feel free to write notes back to the Title I teacher on the calendar.
5. When your child has shown adequate improvement of specific skills, he/she will receive a prize from the Title I teacher. A year end celebration will also be planned for students who have worked at home diligently throughout the year.
